CAN I BRING MY ?

Kids - Yes! Dogs - No. Chairs - Yes. Alcohol/Marijuana - No. Camera - Yes. Glass containers - No. Your love of great music - Yes! Yes! But in case you need more details, read on...

OUR SITE

The Jasper Folk Music Festival is located in Commemoration Park - 1324 Pyramid Lake Road - in the heart of Jasper, Alberta. There is parking at the large Activity Centre parking lot on the other side of the building and there is now also a daily bus service in town! Taxis, bicycles, and dancing feet are also accepted travel means.

WRISTBANDS

When you enter the Main Gate, (located at the entrance nearest to the Jasper Royal Canadian Legion), you will receive either a weekend or a daily wristband. The wristbands are NOT transferable and you must wear the wristband at all times when on site. Seniors 65-79 must show ID for the reduced senior rate. Children 12 and under are free but they must also wear a children's wristband and be accompanied by a ticketed adult. Teens 13-17 get a youth ticket, but they must have ID. (You will also need identification to purchase alcohol at the Beer Gardens.) Our awesome seniors 80 and older are free and can choose if they wish to wear the wristband: they've earned that right!

SAFER SPACES

The Jasper Heritage Folk and Blues Society is committed to providing a safe space for people of all races, ethnicities, ages, gender identity, gender expression, ability, or other personal characteristics. If you are feeling unsafe about any fellow festival-goers or their activities, please notify a volunteer and we will help you.

SEATING

To avoid blocking the view of other patrons, only use seats with a maximum total height of 66 cm (26 inches), with a maximum seat/leg height of no more than 20 cm (8 inches). We also have picnic tables and bleachers scattered throughout the park and everyone is welcome to share those!

PETS

Your Shaggy friend is fine for the festival, just not Scooby. Sorry, Scoobs. No animals are allowed in the festival grounds, (except for certified Service Dogs).

SUPPLIES TO REMEMBER

Water! Some years it can get up to +30! In September!! There is a water bottle refill station inside the Activity Centre. (There are also indoor toilets in there, but who needs those when you have porta potties as an option?) Hats, sunscreen, bug repellent, rain gear, and warm clothes for the evening. (Hey, we didn't say that it STAYED at +30, now did we?)

FIRST AID

The First Aid tent is staffed with volunteer healthcare providers. Look for the red cross and the smiling faces of our trusty volunteers. (If an emergency situation occurs, thankfully the Seton-Jasper Healthcare Centre is only two blocks away.)

ONSITE BEER CONSUMPTION

Fancy way to say Beer Gardens, hey?! Liquor can be consumed across the festival site, but CANNOT be brought onto the site. Bag checks WILL be in effect when you enter the site. Be considerate of your neighbours when consuming beverages at your space. For beverage purchases, look for the big white tent that is NOT the Merch Tent, Zen Zone, or Kids Tent.

SMOKING

In consideration of non-smokers and to comply with provincial and municipal bylaws, smoking is permitted only in the North-East corner of the field. Please pinch and pocket your butts or dispose of them in the sand cans. (Look for the GlowSticks lighting the cans!) And due to municipality bylaws, there is NO marijuana consumption anywhere on the site.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

In the event of an emergency, designated emergency personnel will provide you with instructions. Please remain calm, gather your family, friends and belongings, and use an exit convenient to your means of transport. (The Activity Centre is also a designated Muster location for the Town of Jasper in the event of a town-wide emergency.)

CHILDREN & YOUTH POLICY

Our Children & Youth policy is in place to ensure a safe and enjoyable festival for all at the Jasper Folk Music Festival. Please take the time to read this if you are bringing children or youth into the festival.

- Youth & Children's wristbands will require their accompanying adult's phone number/emergency contact
 to be written on it in order for them to enter the festival grounds.
- It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to ensure their child(ren) comply with all festival rules as well as requests of festival volunteers.
- Minors are to be accompanied at all times and their parent/guardian needs to ensure regular communication with them throughout the festival.
- We would suggest creating a meeting place in case you are separated.
- We will direct any lost children to go to the children's tent if they need help.
- Minors must not engage in any illegal or disruptive activities while on the festival grounds. This includes underage drinking, use of illegal substances and general disruptive behaviour.

Any breach of these conditions may result in the parent/guardian and any accompanying minors being evicted from the festival site.







ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES



BRASSTACTICS

Edmonton's premier brass party band, serving up brass band originals and hot throwbacks from the 70's, 80's, 90's, and 00's. The Brasstactics have been a staple of pop-up outdoor events and live party shows for nearly 3 years in the Edmonton area and are poised for more. New music, recordings, videos and shows are on the horizon for 2022 that are guaranteed to get audiences to dance and sing along. Throw your worries away and get down to the Brasstactics!



CHUBBY CREE

Chubby Cree is an indigenous hand drum group based in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. Led by 12-year-old Noah and his grandmother Carol, the group's stated mission is to spread love and healing, and to connect people through music.





MISERY MOUNTAIN BOYS

You might hear the tunes of the Misery Mountain Boys drifting from behind a rotating bookcase of a 1930's speakeasy. Harkening back to a simpler time, the MMB's create a collaborative soundscape infused with humour, tongue-in-cheek wit, nostalgia, and playfulness. With a mix of catchy originals and contemporary songs reimagined in driving swing, the melodies of the MMB's deliver themselves as both surprising and inevitable.



The only good thing about not shopping in record stores anymore is you won't have to figure out what genre to look for Danny under. If that were the case, you could try looking under, rock, pop, folk, world or even classical. His own self-described musical A.D.D. has kept his music fresh for decades.





WHITEHORSE

Whitehorse is the prolific partnership of Melissa McClelland and Luke Doucet. Uninhibited by expectation, boldly adventurous and categorically talented, Whitehorse's signature sound is always guitarheavy, harmony-plentiful and lyrically deft. With an expansive run of records that freely and thrillingly dip in psychedelic country, pop noir, squalling blues rock and celestial folk, Whitehorse have pushed their musical identity into new realms and sounds for over a decade.



JOSH + BEX

Josh + Bex are a Canadian Dream Folk duo from the Okanagan Valley of BC. Their spellbinding harmonies and honed yet rustic sound, meet at the intersection of hope and sorrow – giving space to let their songs explore light, love, pain, connection and the wondrous realm of the human experience.





MICHAELE RHODES

Michaele Rhodes is a singer-songwriter who started performing last year on some of Jasper's stages. His lyrics and music are clever and soulful, taking inspiration from his own experiences as well as observations of those around him. He draws from nature and memory, and is excited to grow as an artist in the mountains

ZAYNAB WILSON

Zaynab Wilson, a Montreal-born multi-instrumentalist singersongwriter with the spirit of a traveler, anchors to the rhythm, melody, and matters of the psyche wile exploring the depths of her story. She sculpts a soundscape with intrinsic Afro-Caribbean and ancestral rhythms and her soulful vocalization of stories of the inward and outward journeys.





MOONTRICKS

Based in the rustic Kootenay mountains of Western Canada, Nathan Gurley and Sean Rodman draw inspiration from the ongoing cycles of the natural world. Both volatile and constant—like nature's best offerings—the band finds solace and beauty in the fusion of seemingly disparate elements. There's a kind of technicolor campfire quality to their uniquely hybrid sound: Each track is steeped in tradition and polished with a futuristic sheen, mixing organic folk, roots rock, and old-time blues with modern electronic production.

MADDIE STORVOLD & THE WALNUT COLLECTIVE

Tough and sweet like gravel in honey, she can make you laugh and cry, think and ache - all in the same hour. Storvold's music seeks to tell a stroty, to challenge us, to spark delight, and to touch a fragile part of the human spirit. Funny and fresh-faced, this story singer is quickly gaining attention across Canada as a voice to be reckoned with, harkening in a new generation of folk icons.





RAY ELLIOTT BAND

Hailing from Jasper, Alberta, Ray Elliott grew up writing the stories and the music that the mountains wished to share. Heading east and making his home near the North Saskatchewan River, Ray found the voice of the Prairies, and recreated a sound that is unique to his own story. Ray Elliott has been charming audiences for over twenty years with his story telling and his turn of phrase, both lyrically and musically, bringing with him songs that change like the weather in the mountains and flow free like waves on wheat fields.

MIINA

"She's like the little sister who grew up, got feisty and knows she's exactly where she's meant to be" says Laura Mitic, frontwoman to the new musical project, Miina. Miina's debut album - Slow Motion - pulls together the grooviest aspects from each band member's original sound and combines it with new inspiration and musical maturity honed during the still years of the pandemic.





SONS & DAUGHTER



After running out of sweet potatoes, the CPTN headed out across the universe in his Space Galleon, to trade stories and songs for more sweet potatoes.

Creator. Artist. Explorer. Storyteller. It's all about the process for Canadian electronic artist Lucy Locvan. DJ/ Producer, Creative Director, Gamer and Radio DJ – creation is Lucy's journey not her product. A self-confessed dreamer, she's a classically trained composer and pianist who began DJing aged 18, to pay her way through college. As a little girl she taught herself to produce electronic music from YouTube videos on the free Internet at her neighborhood public library before moving on to design games and DJ tours across Canada and North America.




